# 1. Overview and Objectives

#### **Activity Overview**

Authentic children's picture books can be used to introduce students to an L2 and foster intercultural awareness. This series of activities is aimed at lower to mid primary students who have learnt parts of the body and colors already.

## **Learning Objectives**

# 5. Activity Description

Suggested Time	Activity Instructions
5m	Class warm-up song: Head shoulders knees and toes (Material 5)
5-10m	Show the students the book cover. What can they see? Elicit answers (Material 1)
15-30m	Go through the first three features: nose, hair and mouth. Elicit descriptions from the students. Get them to touch their nose, hair, mouth and ask them to look around class to see similarities and differences. Discuss the features and functions of these three (Use many gestures/ Japanese as needed)
	Repeat step above 2nd session: Skin, eyes, and bodies 3rd session: Feelings
30m	Students color in prints and describe their creations in pairs or groups Students can also use soft toys, etc. to give descriptions of body parts similar to the book. E.g. Elephant: big grey ears, Pig: small pink ears







## 6. Additional Information

#### Tips during the activity:

Make the picture book part as interactive as possible.

It will take a couple of sessions to get through the book. The reading of the book needs to be broken up with worksheets and props and small tasks to keep student interested.

#### Post-activity suggestions:

The students could also make a collage using photos of their own body parts, as in the book, to draw attention to similarities and differences. This could also be extended to the other classes in the year level or the school community for a larger school project.

#### Additional application scenarios:

This picture book is a simple start to foster intercultural awareness and could be used as a stepping stone for other picture books with an intercultural awareness or global citizen theme/ SDG theme, including books like Here we are, Notes for living on Planet Earth, Outside my Window or The Island.
