### Set-Up Instructions

- 1. Prepare one slip of paper for each student. Each slip should name a country from the website.
- 2. If necessary, review language for describing scenes and pictures, as explained on the comments of the Activity Context section.

Estimated Set Up Time (min.): 5-15m







# 4. Activity Description

Suggested Time	Activity Instructions
10	Ask students to take out their smart phones and go to the website listed in material 1. Students are usually quite interested in the pictures, so give them time to look at them.
5	Give each student a slip of paper with a country written on it (material 2). Make sure students don't show their paper to their partner. Ask students to find the photo of the bedroom for their country and think about how they can describe it.
20	Students work in pairs. They take turns to describe the room while their partner scrolls through the photos, looking for the room being described. Partners can ask questions to help them guess.
15	Once everyone has described/chosen a room, ask students if they noticed anything about the photos. Depending on their awareness, you may need to guide them. What was the same about the rooms? What was different? Why are some rooms nicely furnished and full of items and others not? Did anything surprise them?
